The RendezVu Don't let the outside fool you, the food is superb

Just north of Wilson on River Street is an unassuming white cinder block building, home to the RendezVu Restaurant. But don't be dissuaded. From first bite, it is clear that Chef Jerry Dunn is more committed to extreme excellence in his culinary craft than he is to an extreme makeover of his space.

We were joined for dinner by Mark and Donna Dettman, who entered our drawing from the Neighbors website (www.neighborsofbatavia.com), and Roger and Judi Breisch. Our evening started with Jerry's personal version of Shrimp Dejohnge, a sampling of favorite, Crusted Almond Tilapia, served with a choice of sides. We all generous portion of fish cooked to vegetables. "Chef Dunn is known for

Almond Crusted Tilapia By Chef Jerry Dunn

The RendezVu 102 North River Street Batavia, 406-9177


Ingredients (per portion)

- One Tilapia filet
- 1 oz whole butter
- 1 oz white wine
- 1 oz lemon juice
- 1 oz chicken stock or broth
- Fresh chopped Italian flat parsley
- Kosher salt & pepper
- Slivered almonds
- Flour
- Oven safe sauté pan
- 1. For the almond flour, in a food processor pulse 1 cup of flour with 1 tbs. Almonds
- 2. Preheat oven to 350°

- 3.Start a pan over medium heat, add approx 1 oz. of olive oil or cooking oil to pan, heat for about a minute
- 4. Lightly salt and pepper tilapia filet and dredge in almond flour, patting off excess flour
- 5. Place tilapia in pan, for about two minutes or until fish is lightly browned, checking constantly, flip fish and place in pan in oven for five minutes.
- 6. Take pan from oven and place fish on plate. Return pan to medium flame and add white wine, lemon

Almond Crusted Tilapia and a serving of Chef Dunn's vegetables

- juice, then check stock or broth, bring to a boil, turn off heat, add butter and swirl butter just until melted.
- 7. Add parsley and pour sauce over fish, garnish with extra almonds if desired.
